Graduate Profile: Cynthia Saenz, Class of 2009 and 2007 Administrative Medical Assistant and Medical Assisting Programs Milan Institute – Indio, CA

Before Cynthia Saenz enrolled at Milan Institute in Indio, California, she was a homemaker of five years struggling through a divorce. "As a single mother of three children with only a high school diploma and a few college credits, I knew a two- or four- year college wasn't in the cards for me," states Cynthia. "I figured if I could find a school that offered night classes, was affordable, and had a short-term program, that school would be the school for me." She found exactly what she was looking for at Milan and enrolled in the Administrative Medical Assistant program (AMA program) in early 2007.

In addition to the skills and knowledge she learned in her AMA program, Cynthia also received the support she needed to build her confidence. "I thought it was great that the school recognized students for their academic achievements," recalls Cynthia Saenz on her experience at Milan Institute. "I knew students who had never been acknowledged for their school performance, but at Milan students from every program would gather and cheer when a student received an award. Milan Institute first opened its doors to Boise, Idaho, in January 2001. It only had two programs to begin with, but now it offers seven: Healthcare Billing and Coding, Administrative Medical Assistant, Medical Assisting, Dental Assistant, Pharmacy Technician, Massage Therapy and its newest program, Esthetician. The school also opened an auxiliary classroom in Nampa, Idaho, in September 2003 due to the Boise campus's increasing popularity. To date, the school has helped over 2,200 students graduate.

Milan Institute is located in the scenic city of Boise, which is known as "The City of Trees." It is the capital and most populous city in Idaho. The Boise River offers recreational activities such as swimming, fishing or rafting, and Boise also boasts great skiing and snowboarding during the winter. In addition, the city hosts cultural events throughout the year and possesses vibrant music and theatre scenes.

The Boise campus has come a long way since it first opened, largely due to the efforts of School Director Barb

DeHaan. Barb has been the acting Director for the school since 2002. Prior to working for Milan Institute, she was an instructor at ITT Technical Institute for 21 years. She spent the first 17 years of her time at ITT developing and implementing a Medical Secretarial/Transcription program. From there, Barb went on to teach communications, proofreading, math and project management classes. Since joining Milan Institute, she has learned a lot and loves her job. "I have surrounded myself with a great staff, and we all share common goals," states Barb DeHaan about the Boise campus. "The one comment we hear most often from quests is that 'it just feels good here,' and that's the way we like it."

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Company Highlights: Milan Institute in Amarillo Raises Thousands of Dollars for the American Cancer Society Relay For Life®

On Friday, June 12, 2009, Milan Institute in Amarillo, Texas, participated for its fifth year in the American Cancer Society Relay For Life®. This life-changing event brings together more than 3.5 million people across the country each year to celebrate the lives of those who have battled cancer, remember loved ones lost and fight back against a disease that takes too much. The overnight relay empowered everyone to fight cancer by raising money and awareness. Relay teams camped out at various locations and took turns walking or running around a track. Each team had a representative on the track at all times during the event. The relay was held at the Amarillo National Bank Dilla Villa in Amarillo, Texas.

Twenty Milan Institute staff members and forty-five students participated in the event. Crystal Follis, School Director of Milan Institute, showed her support by serving as the Accounting Officer on the Amarillo Relay For Life[®] Committee. Laura Wideman, Registrar, and Lindsay Sullivan, Career Services Coordinator, led the Milan Institute teams as captains in the relay. "We supported Relay For Life[®] because of the awareness we were able to raise here at our school and also because many of our own loved ones have fought this terrible disease," stated Laura Wideman. "This was a great way for Milan Institute to give back." The students' energy at the event caught the attention of the relay committee,

which presented them with an award for the most inspirational team.

Both the staff and students of Milan Institute worked hard to raise money for the relay. Students organized raffles, bake sales, and lunch sales to help support the fundraiser. They also set up one collection pot for their Director and one for their Dean. Students added money to the pot for the staff member they wanted to see doused with goo. In the end, it was Crystal Follis who was slimed for having the most money in her pot. "I smelled like garlic for two days!" exclaimed Crystal on "winning" the collection pot. The staff also sold luminary bags, which were placed along the track during the relay. Each bag represented the life of someone who had battled cancer. At the end of the event, the school had raised an amazing \$4,180 and was recognized as the fourth highest contributor to the fundraiser.

after he graduated from Milan Institute was the official salon for the San Antonio Spurs, which allowed him to work closely with both the players and cheerleaders. The opportunity opened the door for Chance's salon to work on more celebrity concerts in the future.

Success continued to follow her even after graduation from the AMA program. Soon after completing her externship, Cynthia was hired by her extern site; but she didn't stop there. In early 2008 she enrolled at Milan Institute in Indio again, this time in the Medical Assisting program. "Six months after I started working as an administrative medical assistant, I saw that a lot of the action was happening in the back," says Cynthia. "The interaction and involvement that the medical assistants had with the patients interested me. That was when I decided to continue my education."

Cynthia was again hired immediately after completing her Medical Assisting externship. She currently works for a family practitioner at the Eisenhower Medical Center in Rancho Mirage, California, and loves her job. "Not only am I applying what I have already learned, but I'm also learning new things every day," states Cynthia about her new position as a Medical Assistant. "The staff is great, and the doctor is fantastic. I constantly ask questions, and the doctor is always ready and willing to "school me." She is also in the process of completing a phlebotomy course as a part of her continuing education efforts.

She advises other students to be confident and ambitious and to not be easily discouraged. "Be forgiving of your mistakes because that is how you learn," says Cynthia to her fellow Milan students. "And remember that you alone are responsible for the outcome of your future. private education, primarily in admissions and marketing. He worked at ITT Technical Institute for 22 years, was the School Director of the Court Reporting Institute in Boise for 5 years and has assisted Milan in various capacities since its inception. Larry was instrumental in the development and building of the student dental clinics at the Boise and Nampa locations. Additionally, his strong eye for interior design proved invaluable during the remodeling of the student massage and esthetics spas. Both Barb and her staff are greatly appreciative of his expertise.

Milan Institute has big plans for the future. The population of the auxiliary classroom in Nampa now rivals that of the Boise school for a total of over 375 students combined. As a result, Barb is recommending that the auxiliary classroom be transitioned to a freestanding campus. She believes the Nampa location would benefit from the presence of a complete administrative staff due to the large student population. She hopes to begin the transition in early 2010. If the Nampa location does successfully become a separate campus, it will eventually offer valued-priced dental services to low income families like the Boise student dental clinic. Both locations anticipate the addition of new programs within the next year.
